Coding & Problem solving



Lego Class K3- K5

Legos is a great platform for learners of all ages to develop problem solving skills. The learners can be challenged in various forms to build some of the below skills:

- Following instructions
- Foster creativity
- Develop understanding of structures and buildings
- Improve fine motor skills
- Practice measuring, sorting, patterning

Math Club (G1-G2)


Expand your math horizons with the PYP Math Club! We will explore a variety of mathematical investigations that build on and go beyond what students are learning about in class, through art projects, games, and more. Time will also be allocated for homework and studying, with support at each student's level. Math lovers as well as those struggling with math are all welcome!

Coding (G1 - G2)

The introduction to coding begins with tactile learning as part of Computational Thinking. Students use LittleBits and LEGO blocks to physically practice skills in programming concepts like sequencing, events, and loops while engaging in teamwork and resolving challenges.

Coding (G3 - G5)

The next step in coding begins with engineering and robotics as part of the Design Process. Students use



LittleBits and LEGO WeDo to express creatively, create, problem-solve, and construct simple programs through an accompanying app. Themed activities promote out-of-the-box thinking and explore real-world topics.



We are excited to announce that this year's ASP coding classes will offer BSD curriculum lessons.



Performing Arts



Dance K3-K5

Students will learn how to dance to the rhythm and learn dance techniques from all genres. Through our dance club, students will learn important life skills such as how to play hard and work hard. Dance training for young people encourages a positive outlook and promotes an active lifestyle. Let's have fun together!

Street Dance Class G1-2, G3-5

This program focuses on helping students develop life skills through street dance culture based on the tenants below.

•Raku 楽 : Have Fun!

Providing the right environment is key for DANCE to be fun. This starts with allowing students express themselves freely and creatively in a safe classroom setting.

•Shu 守 : Respect the Basics

We respect the roots of dance culture by learning the basics. Students will develop a foundation in various street dance styles including Hip Hop, House, Popping and Locking.

•Ha 破: Create and Breakthrough We will cultivate creativity and individuality so that each student can choreograph their original dance and learn to freestyle based on previously learned movements.

•Ri 離: Share the Culture

We encourage our students to share the history and art of street dance culture throughout the world.

Youth Theatre - G5 and up

Learners will develop theatre skills and confidence through engagement in drama workshops and performance opportunities. Throughout the year, learners will explore different styles of theatre and will have the opportunity to work with scripted texts and also devise their own original work. Learners will also develop important life skills such as teamwork, communication and empathy throughout engagement in this program.



Music

Music class K3-K5

Students will participate in a wide range of musical experiences including performance in a Christmas program, movement, games, singing and listening to various styles of music.

Taiko

What we cherish for the activity of Taiko are the following three points.

- To make a good quality sound with a drum play the drums with your heart.
- Listen not only to yourself but also to the drums of others.
- Learn the discipline and customs of playing.



There are many kinds of drums and various ways to

play them. Although you can't play a melody like a piano with taiko drums, playing drums in combination with various sounds and rhythms makes you feel very happy and satisfied. I want young people from all over the world to know and enjoy our traditional Japanese drums.



Beginners and Intermediate Handbell Club - G3 - G5 Ten students max

This is the class for those who were in Beginners Handbell Club last year. Learners without experience in handbell are asked to talk to Mr. Koike.

Learners with high handbell skills will be nominated to Advanced Handbell Choir.

Concert Band

Concert Band meets on Fridays and is for G4 and G5 students who are beginning to learn their instrument or continuing after their first year of playing. We will develop our skills, attitudes, and musicality as an ensemble. Older beginner students are more than welcome to join.



Advanced Handbell Choir - Gr.5 and nominated PYP students

This is the class to learn ensembles through Handbells. Learners will learn higher technique of handbell and music theories through the year.

Handbell Choir will be asked to perform at official school events and public events outside of school.



Beginning Orchestra (Friday) - G3 and up. No limit

Beginning Orchestra is for 3rd graders and older who are just beginning to learn their instruments, including strings such as Violins, and more about music. The orchestra will learn separately for the first half of the year and then join with the beginning band for an enriching ensemble experience after the winter holiday. Students will be required to attend an extra lesson during a break once a week to get one-on-one coaching. If students do not already own a string instrument, they will need to rent one from an outside company.



Creative

Art K3-G5

Art classes are project based and give the students a chance to really explore various art mediums and express creativity.

Students in middle school and high school will have the chance to display their artwork at the annual artscape show which involved all the international schools around Tokyo.
